


Sepia officinalis (Linnaeus, 1758)



The English Channel, Northeast Atlantic, showing ICES Divisions VIIe and VIIId.




Cuttlefish Production Areas include the English Channel, Celtic Sea, and the French West coast.

The general near-surface water movement in the English Channel and Celtic Sea (BODC, 1998). CUTTLEFISH SEEM TO FOLLOW THE FLOW






Cuttlefish Production in Brixham 1982 to 2015
