- EMPA made up of Associations from **England, France, Scotland, Ireland, Spain, Italy, Holland, Denmark**
 - New interest from Portugal, Greece, Croatia and others
- Reported to Advisory Council of Fisheries and Aquaculture (ACFA)
- This changed with the implementation of the revised Common Fisheries Policy.

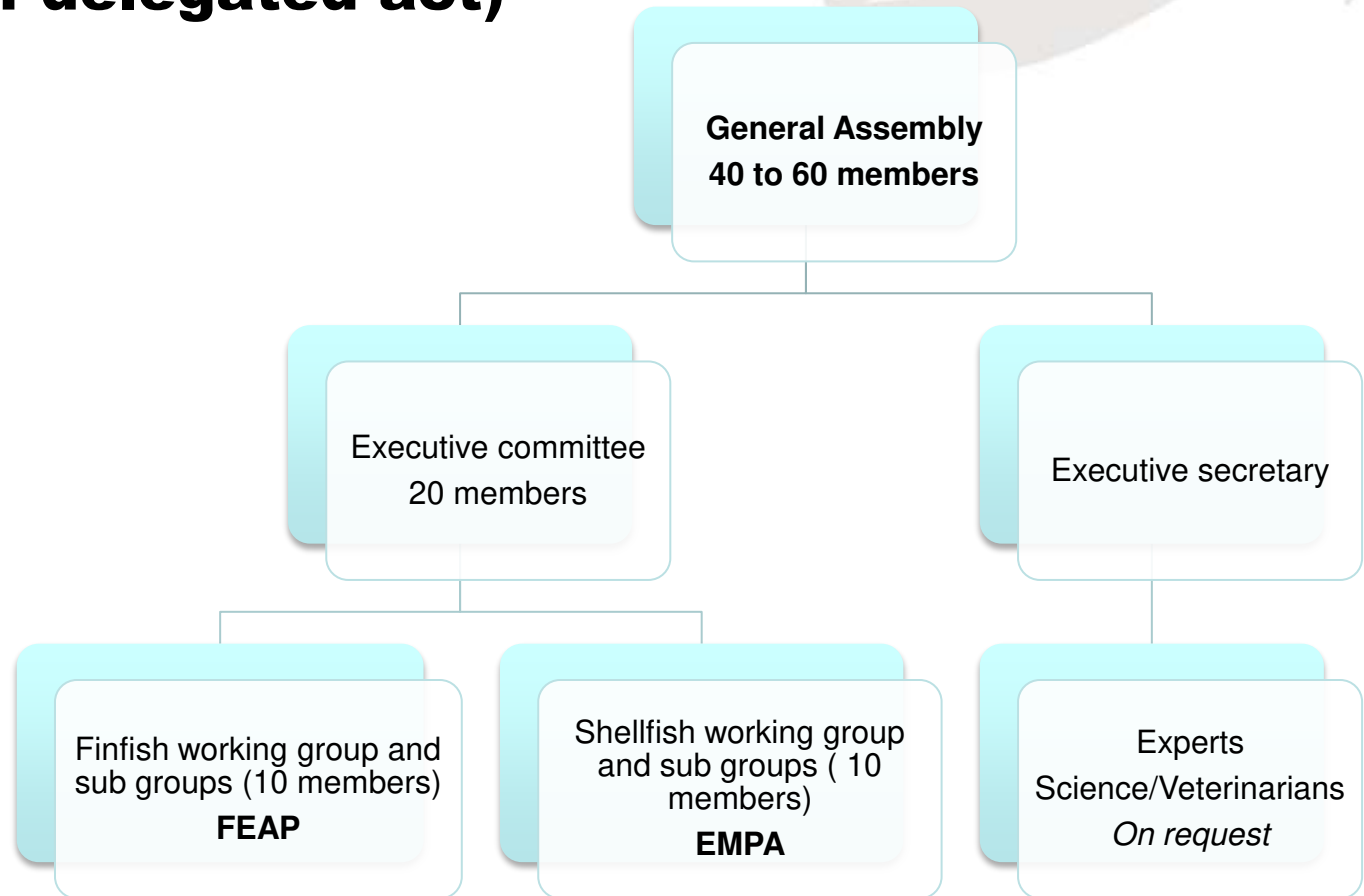
AAC Structure (Article 45 R 1380 and Article 4 of delegated act)

- + request to Member States Governments (€3000?)

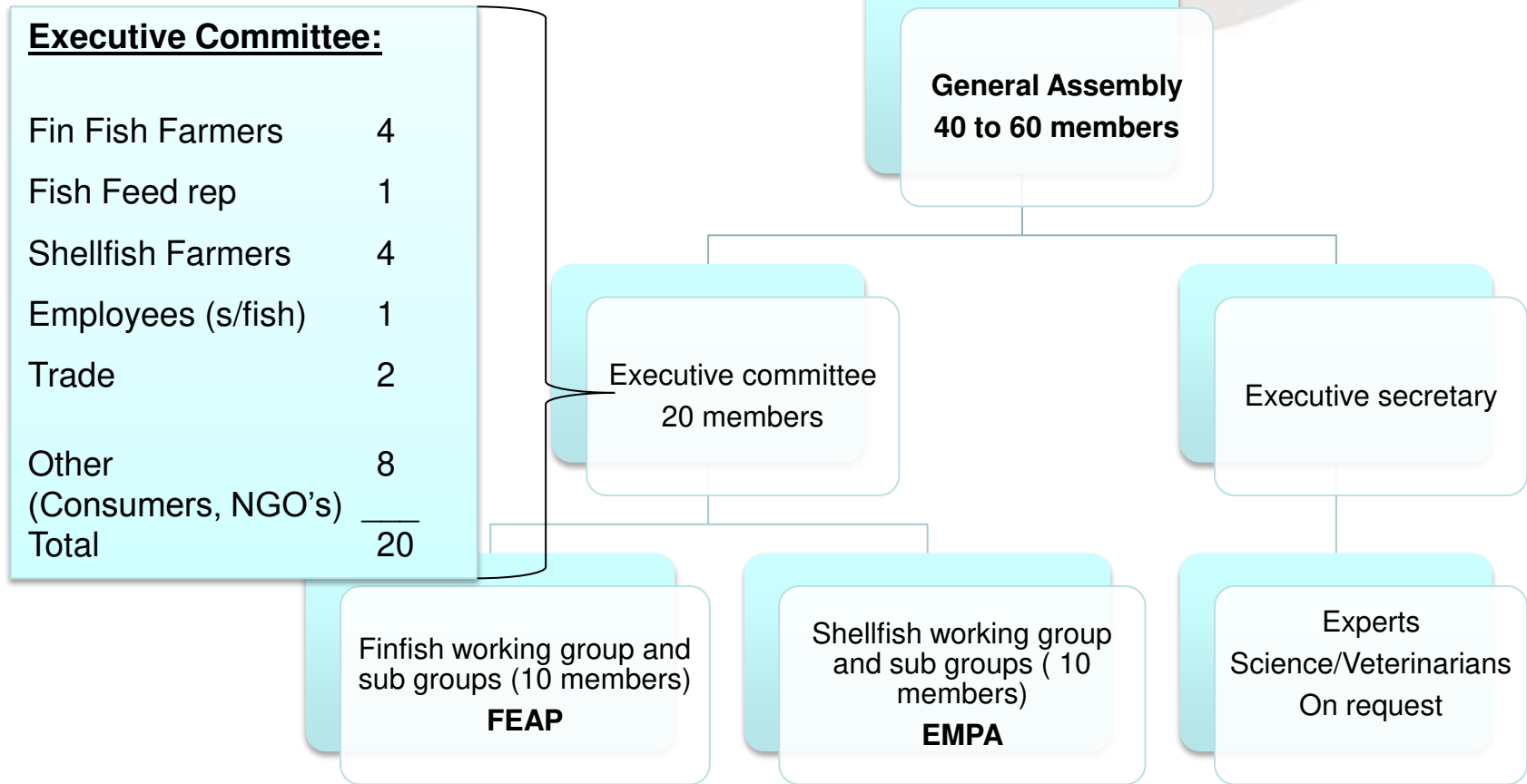


AAC Structure (Article 45 R 1380 and Article 4 of delegated act)



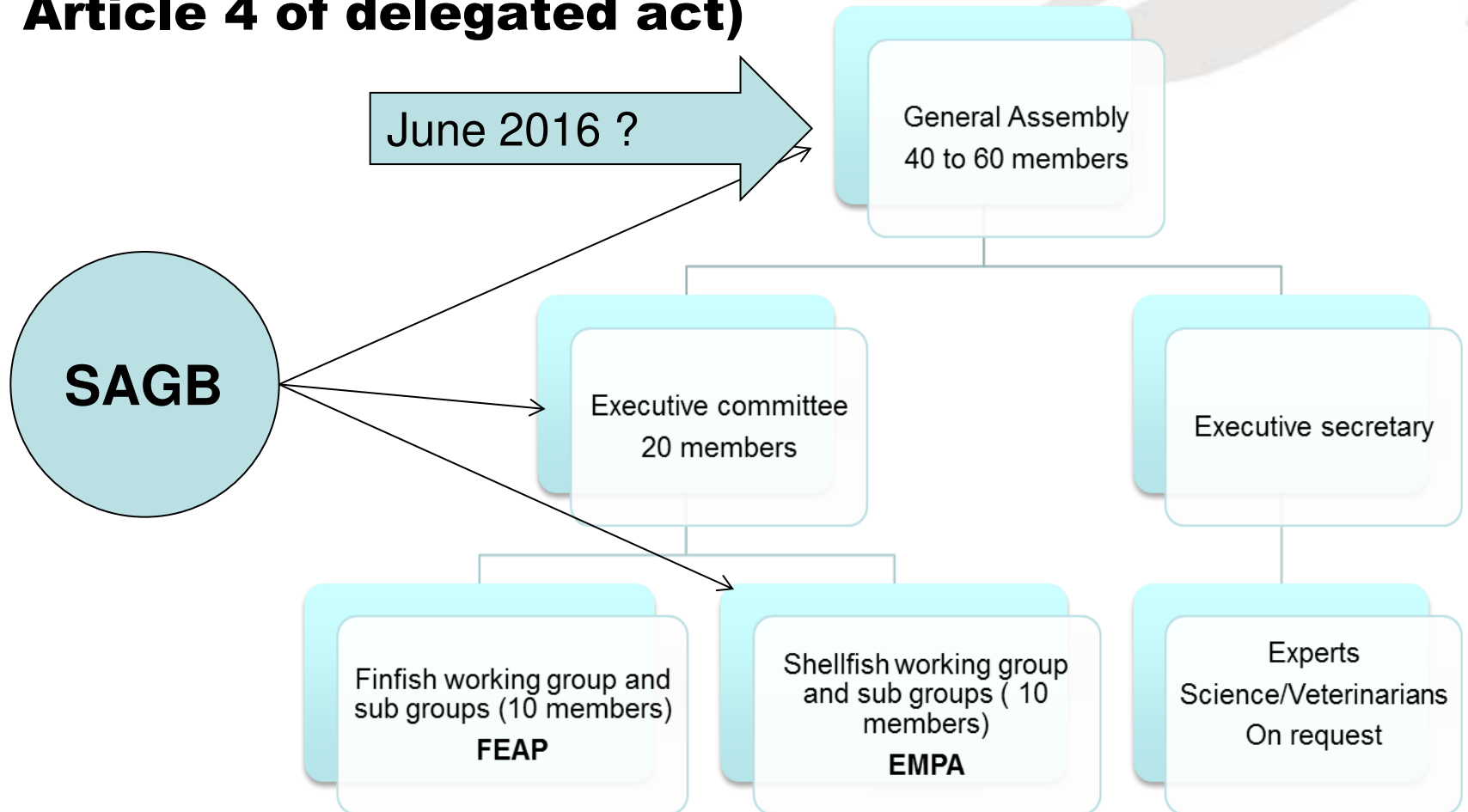
